#### (Women and Children Succeeding)



AlM's Women and Children Succeeding program is a college support program for low-income mothers. Our goal is to transition the families we serve toward an independent, self-sufficient, and successful life. To remove the economic barriers that face mothers who are seeking post-secondary education, we assist with the costs of childcare, transportation, education, and emergency events. We were recently made aware that DSS would no longer fund childcare with the DSS block grant that provided \$114,000 of funds that provided quality educational programs for our Women and Children Succeeding (WACS) clients' children. Since we can no longer count on funding from the State of South Carolina to provide the support needed to assist our families move from dependency on government support to total self-sufficiency we need your help. If we are going to continue to touch the lives of these families, this community is going to have to step up and support our initiative to educate and empower these women and their children.

Will you sponsor a child for a year (\$6,750)? Provide a month of childcare (\$540)? Sponsor one week (\$135) for a child to remain in a stable, educational childcare facility while his/her mom attends college full time?

For AIM to continue to "Give Hope and Change Lives" we need your investment; I promise you the return is HUGE!!

#### **EDUCATION AND WORK FORCE DEVELOPMENT**

This department focuses on the foundation for employment and job retention. We provide a variety of professional development opportunities for Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens County residents which lead to a full-time career and job retention. These opportunities include Educational Workshops and Employment Pathways.



Employment Pathways connects participants with resources and education to work toward full-time sustainable employment. Program participants work with a Career Coach to evaluate employment needs

and develop a plan of action. The individualized plans include a variety of experiences to enhance learning and are frequently modified with progress. Guidance and support are provided by the Career Coach throughout program enrollment.

#### **HOUSING PROGRAM**

AlM's Housing Program is phasing out Rapid Re-housing and re-vamping our Emergency and Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation program to help low-income families keep their homes safe and livable. For many families this home is all they have, so keeping it in good condition is vital

Our Ramps and Minor Repairs program is full-steam a head working with the Appalachian Council of Governments to keep providing families with wheelchair, and access ramps.

#### ASSESSMENT AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

This Summer our Assessment and Emergency Assistance program was blessed by Electrolux, and in turn has been able to bless several families as well. Electrolux, in June, donated 32 Air Conditioning Units and 24 Full Sized Refrigerators to AIM. Both the AC Units and the refrigerators have made huge impacts on our client's lives.
